

RWIEF FUNDING AT WORK

Making a difference in ROW

Since 1976, the Right of Way International Education Foundation (RWIEF) has supported the IRWA in building and improving its education programing. IRWA determines education needs and RWIEF provides funding. As a 501(c)3 entity, donations to RWIEF are tax deductible, and this structure provides a secure holding place to grow a corpus dedicated to right of way education. RWIEF funding has created new courses, updated existing courses, converted classroom courses to online formats and revised the “Principles of Right of Way” textbook. But that’s not all. Funding for the Leadership Institute produced 11 online modules of leadership training that is free — yes, FREE — to IRWA members. RWIEF has also funded the successful RWIEF Region Professional of the Year, 40 for 40 Launching Careers and 20/20 Vision Scholarship programs. Finally, we continue to manage and grow the original donation for the California State Association of Real Property Agents (SARPA) Scholarship.

We all missed attending last year’s conference. Foundation trustees particularly missed hosting our annual Monday Night Event and golf tournament. But we have not been idle. Over fall and winter 2020/2021, major education improvements have been made. Here are the accomplishments made possible with RWIEF funds and the hard work of IRWA education staff:

- Revisions and updates have been made to 17 online courses. Obsolete Flash player elements were converted to an HTML5 format compatible across all web browsers. Functionality issues such as slides that would not advance, nonresponsive print buttons, typographical errors, corrections to exercise answers and mathematical problems and outdated terminology have been corrected. In addition, visual aspects such as color, font and logos have been aligned with current IRWA branding standards.
- Our ongoing 20/20 Vision Scholarship has furthered the education of 20 scholars and thus far, produced 12 new RWAs and four new RWPs.
- Video production of Course 102, “Elevating Your Ethical Awareness,” is complete, and the course is in circulation.

So where does funding come from? YOU! Chapter and Region members, plus leading industry corporations, generously donate money, along with their time, energy and passion to raise funds. You will see that energy and passion again this year. Our Monday Night Event will be held June 7 at the Espee, the beautifully renovated Southern Pacific Railway Depot in San Antonio, TX. Our Alamo Classic Golf Tournament will be held June 8 at the TPC San Antonio Canyons Course, designed by Pete Dye. All profits from these events go directly to education funding.
